### Now, with the “How Was This Date Calculated” feature

You need to know, as quickly as possible, when important dates and deadlines change. CompuLaw's Vision Web Portal (VWP) provides access to your Vision Calendar information securely over the web, day or night.

Our latest release, Version 3.3, includes the new “How Was This Date Calculated” (“HWTDC”) feature, simplifying calendaring and making it more convenient for law firms. With “HWTDC,” users can view, in detail, just how a date calculation is formulated (see page two).

Further enhancements in technology include an update to **Standard Microsoft ASP.NET technology**, giving the VWP application a more dynamic, intuitive feel. Color schemes, logos, various user interface aspects, formats of pre-selected data, event lists/define event data, displays and reports are all now **completely customizable**.

View only the dates you need while easily filtering out the items you don't want to see. You can also take advantage of improved remote capabilities, such as the ability to send requests for calendar changes while you are out of the office, as well as enhanced security and customization features.

### Share your docket information with your clients

We've added a new “Client” user type—you can now grant your clients secure, restricted access to specific matter calendar data. Users give clients' access by setting up “client accounts” with passwords that restrict the clients' view to all matters for a specific client, or to only specific matters. Your firm maintains complete password control.

### Instant reports & communication

Administrative tasks have been integrated into the VWP, making it easier and more intuitive. The latest version of the VWP utilizes menus along the top of each page allowing you to quickly and easily navigate to any part of the application. A new dynamic data entry using “Drag & Drop” formatting to modify event data views is now provided for convenience and ease of use. List selections jump directly to matching input as you type data into validated fields.

The Portal even includes a sophisticated, yet easy-to-use report writer that allows you to design and save your own report formats—all through your web browser! The VWP can even send new calendar events and changes directly to your docket department or directly to Vision. Submitting calendar requests directly from the “Event Detail” page automatically fills in the fields on the calendar request page—information is entered only once.

## How did you get that date?

Now, it's easier than ever to understand just how a date calculation is formulated with CompuLaw's "How Was This Date Calculated" feature, included with Vision Web Portal™ version 3.3 (released Spring 2008).

"How Was This Date Calculated" provides Portal users with both a written description of how each date is calculated, as well as a graphical calendar demonstrating each step in the process. The graphical calendar shows each date, court dates, holidays and weekends, and how they are counted. Easy to understand arrows and descriptions, start dates and stop dates, are all displayed, making calendaring much more convenient for law firms.

Don't forget court holidays. Sometimes, even the most practiced attorney might overlook a court holiday, especially when a case is out of their usual jurisdiction. Even when the holiday is taken into account, there can be confusion about how many days to count backwards or forwards—or not at all. The "How Was This Date Calculated" feature takes all the guesswork out of the equation.

Vision Web Portal - Windows Internet Explorer

Authority: ADR Rule E-2(b), F-3; FRCP 6(a)(2)

Formula: Count forward 15 calendar days, if this date lands on a non-court day move the date forward to the next court day. Then count forward 5 court work days.

Trigger: Date of order of referral to ADR.	2/1/2008
Count forward 15 calendar days.	2/16/2008
Move forward to the next court work day.	2/19/2008
Count forward 5 court work days.	2/26/2008
Event: If no objection to ADR referral filed and if parties failed to agree on ADR neutral, last court day to submit to opposing party list of four neutrals from register of neutrals. Opposing party to submit list to ADR clerk 5 days thereafter.	2/26/2008

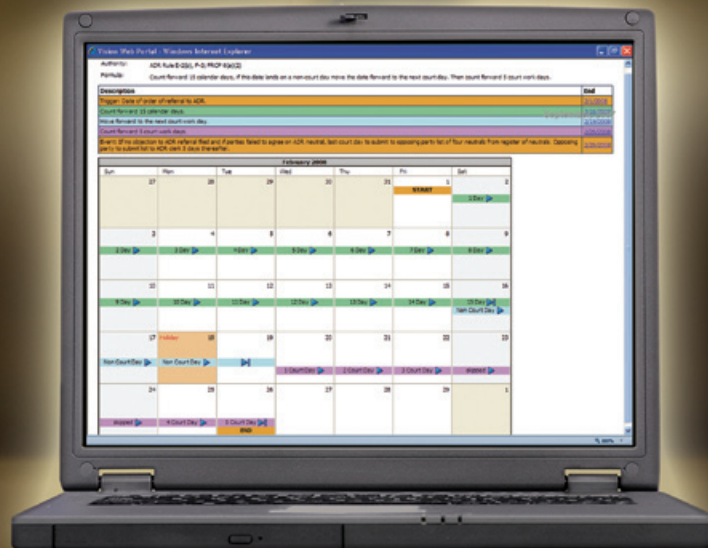
